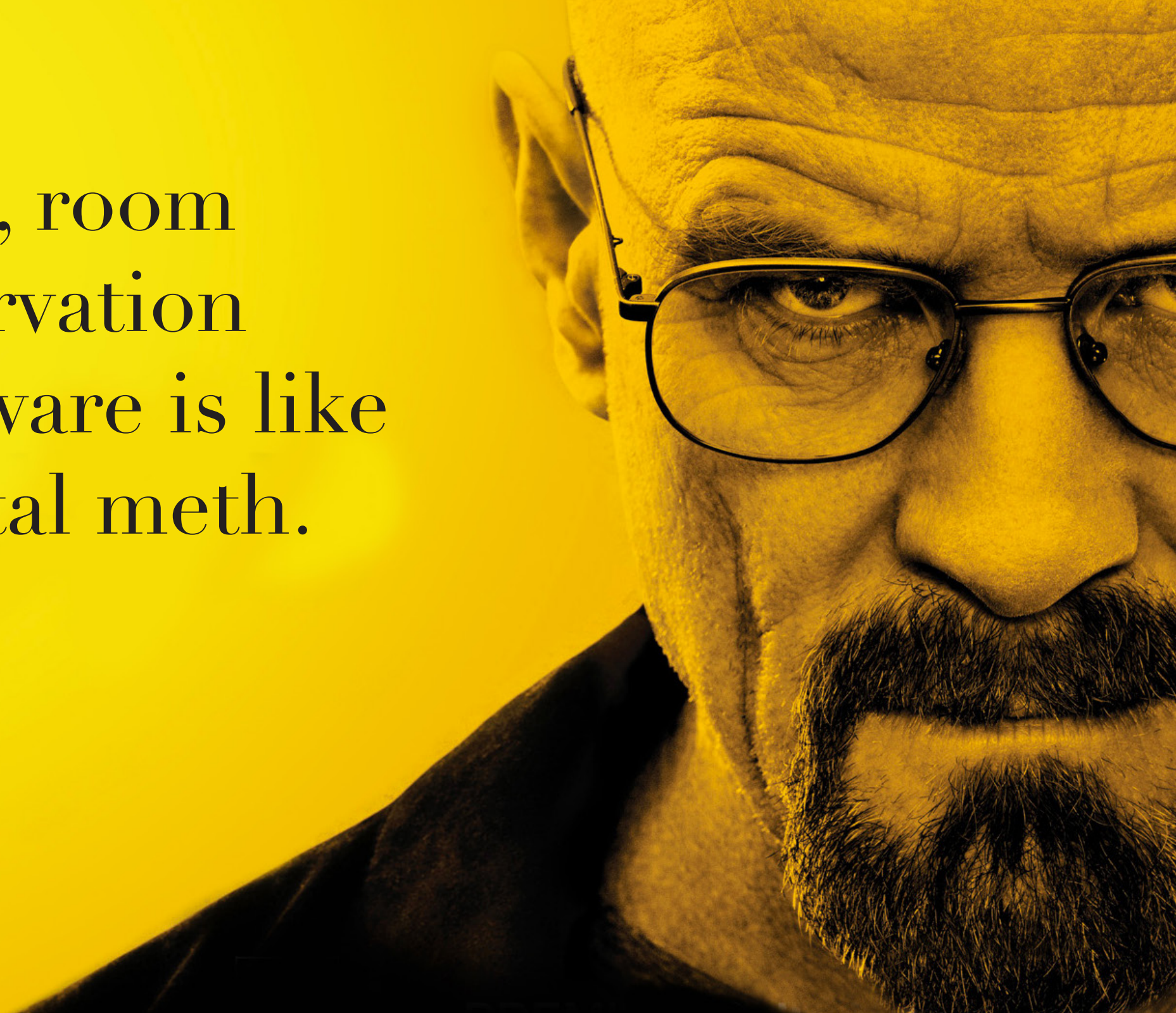
Why are all these

Some ideas and
suggestions that
might help if your
calendar sucks

1. Tell everyone who will listen to you that *events are a crucially important part of marketing your school.*

“What do students do on the weekends?”

“Is it boring to live in a small town like _____?”

“What is my alma mater doing with my money?”

These are all questions that people actually ask, and calendars are the only way to answer them.

2. Don't go anywhere near a calendaring solution that doesn't export data in open formats like RSS.

Marketing alert: Mine does

3. Remember that a perfect calendar has to be all things to all people, and that's impossible.

3. This means that your calendar will inevitably disappoint some people, even if it doesn't suck.
